 - Positions the town for technical and financial assistance



LWRP Project Area and Vision Statement








Housing overview

Single Family – predominant housing type in Marlborough

- Apartment complexes for seniors
- New multifamily complex approved, providing 2 and 3 bedroom apartments






Housing Overview .

Housing affordability is expressed in 3 levels:

- Affordable < 30% of gross income
- Unaffordable > 30% of gross income
- Severe > 50% of gross income


Youth Services—some examples from nearby communities
