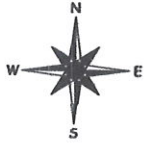

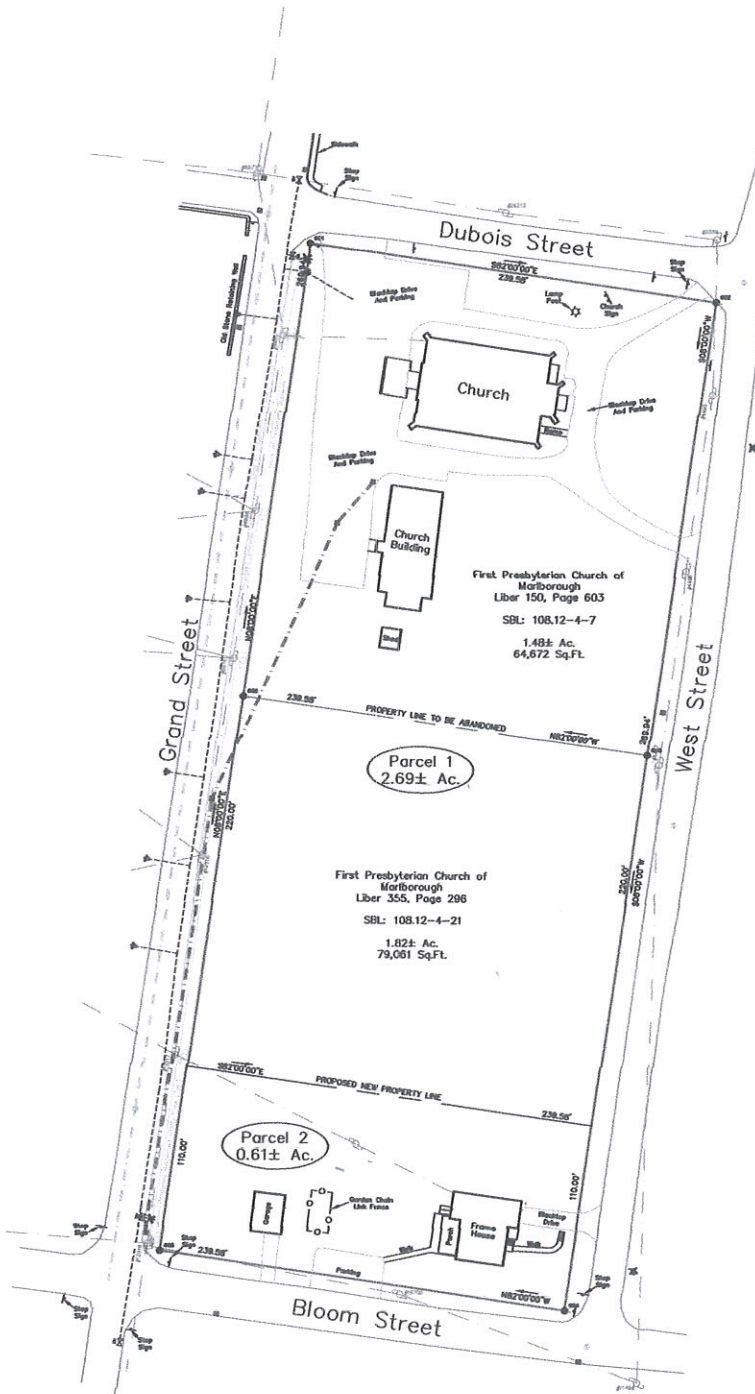

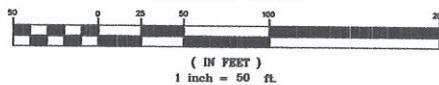


Lot Line Alteration

1. The first building is a small, single-story structure, approximately 10 feet by 10 feet, located in the upper left corner of the site. It is identified as the "Main Building" and is used for general office work and storage.

2. The second building is a larger, two-story structure, approximately 20 feet by 30 feet, located in the center of the site. It is identified as the "Warehouse" and is used for storing large quantities of goods and materials.

3. The third building is a small, single-story structure, approximately 10 feet by 10 feet, located in the lower left corner of the site. It is identified as the "Garage" and is used for parking and servicing vehicles.

4. The fourth building is a small, single-story structure, approximately 10 feet by 10 feet, located in the lower right corner of the site. It is identified as the "Toolshed" and is used for storing tools and equipment.

5. The fifth building is a small, single-story structure, approximately 10 feet by 10 feet, located in the upper right corner of the site. It is identified as the "Bathroom" and is used for personal hygiene.

6. The sixth building is a small, single-story structure, approximately 10 feet by 10 feet, located in the center of the site, adjacent to the Warehouse. It is identified as the "Kitchen" and is used for preparing food and beverages.

7. The seventh building is a small, single-story structure, approximately 10 feet by 10 feet, located in the center of the site, adjacent to the Kitchen. It is identified as the "Living Room" and is used for relaxation and social activities.

8. The eighth building is a small, single-story structure, approximately 10 feet by 10 feet, located in the center of the site, adjacent to the Living Room. It is identified as the "Bedroom" and is used for sleeping.

9. The ninth building is a small, single-story structure, approximately 10 feet by 10 feet, located in the center of the site, adjacent to the Bedroom. It is identified as the "Bathroom" and is used for personal hygiene.

10. The tenth building is a small, single-story structure, approximately 10 feet by 10 feet, located in the center of the site, adjacent to the Bathroom. It is identified as the "Closet" and is used for storing clothing and accessories.
